1. Marta Zasada	2	3	3	3
COMMENTS: You have organised your ideas clearly, but you did not analyse exactly what the task required you to do. Although you have described what you have achieved, and two of the problems, you have only suggested one change that is not related to training needs. It is essential that you read the task carefully and address it fully. Because of this, and also because of the fact that your answer is a little short, you have not displayed the full range of language you may be capable of.				
2. Jana Januszkiewicz	3	2	2	2
COMMENTS: You have written your report in a suitable format with appropriate headings, and although you have said that enrolling in future courses would improve skills, you do not seem to have developed this idea very fully. You use a good range of vocabulary, but at times your message is rather confusing and it would be a good idea to work on organising your ideas so that they are communicated clearly. For example, if you have two separate ideas, such as attending fairs, and then workshops, make sure each individual idea is clearly communicated. You should also work on avoiding errors that make your message unclear.				
3. Joanna Fiuk	2	3	3	3
COMMENTS: You have written a clear report that communicates your ideas on achievements and problems well. Unfortunately, you did not address the third point properly, as you should have written about future training that would be helpful. You could have mentioned courses to improve your editing speed, for example, or in a new editing programme. You use an appropriate range of language, but it would be a good idea to revise the verb forms used in conditionals.				
4. Ada Jaskowiaic	4	2	3	2
COMMENTS: You have addressed all parts of the task, although you only really needed to make suggestions for further training, rather than general suggestions. Your ideas are generally well organised, but there are a number of basic errors, so it would be a good idea to do a grammar review, and don't forget to go through your work very carefully when you have finished writing, as the number of errors do make it difficult to follow your message at times.				
5. Magdalena Urbanek	5	3	3	2
COMMENTS: You have addressed the task well and analysed the three parts fully. You have organised your ideas well in suitable paragraphs with appropriate headings. Although you use some good work-related vocabulary, there are a large number of basic errors, for example in singulars and plurals. It is essential that you work on accuracy, so that that lack of it does not have a negative effect on your mark.				

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6. Justyna Swiech	4	4	4	3
COMMENTS: It is important that you read the task carefully, as it asked you to write about your own personal experiences, rather than those of all the dental surgeons in the hospital. However, you have written an effective and thorough report, and used an appropriate range of grammatical structures and vocabulary.

COMMENTS: You have covered all the points, but at times the language you use is so impersonal that it is difficult to see that you are talking about your own experience. If you are talking about a personal experience, a passive form may not always be the most appropriate. At times, because of this, your message becomes over-complicated and it is a little difficult to follow your ideas.				
8. Ewa Knapp	5	4	3	3
COMMENTS: This is a thorough report and you have covered all the required points fully. You have organised your ideas into a format suitable for a report with appropriate headings and argued your points clearly. There are some basic errors, for example, in the use of the article, prepositions and the use of cohesive devices, so these are all areas that you could work on to improve your writing.				
9. Katarzyna Swiatek	5	2	3	3
COMMENTS: This is generally a well organised piece of writing, which you have arranged in suitable paragraphs with appropriate headings. However, the report was supposed to be about your progress and as it was written in a totally impersonal style, it wasn't always clear that you were talking about yourself. It is possible to write about yourself in a formal style, which is what was required. There are some errors, so it is important to check your work when you have finished writing.				
10. Patryk Wzodarczyck	5	2	3	2
COMMENTS: Your ideas are well organised into suitable paragraphs with appropriate headings. You were asked to write a report about your own progress and in the first part your tone was very impersonal, so it wasn't clear that you were talking about yourself. When you did start writing about yourself, some of your language was rather informal, for example, 'great' - what you needed to do was write about your own progress, etc. in a formal way. You could work on developing the range of words and phrases you use to introduce and link your ideas.				
11. Rafal Szczepanik	5	4	3	4
COMMENTS: This is an original report, which used some suitable topic-related vocabulary and was interesting to read. You have addressed all parts of the task well. You could work on improving the range of words and phrases you use to introduce and organise your ideas. There are also some errors (for example, the word is 'species'), so it is always worth reading through your work carefully when you have finished writing.				

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12. Aleksandra Habieka	2	3	3	2
COMMENTS: Although you have written an effective report, you unfortunately did not analyse the task requirements fully. The third part was not about how you could improve the job in general, but what training would benefit you in the future. You have presented some interesting ideas, though. Your language mark would improve if you paid a little more attention to detail and left time at the end to check carefully for errors, such as in singulars and plurals.				
13. Andrzej Stempnik	4	4	4	4
COMMENTS: This is an effective report, which uses a very good range of topic-related vocabulary, and is interesting to read. It would have been better, and would have addressed the question more closely, if you had personalised this a little more, relating it to your own direct experience, and if you had addressed the question of problems directly, rather than from the angle of improvements that could be made.				
14. Jacek Pasnik	4	3	4	4
COMMENTS: Your report is rather confusing as you chose to address it on a project by project basis, rather than analysing and addressing the three parts of the question in turn. It is a good idea to make a plan before you start, clearly based on the various task parts. You were supposed to suggest some further training for yourself, rather than for other workers. The introduction is particularly confusing, so if you want to delete something, this is acceptable, but make sure it is clear what you have and haven't deleted. Otherwise, you clearly have a good grasp of the English language, and a little more planning should make your writing much more effective.				
15. Pawel Jedraszek	4	4	3	2
COMMENTS: You have written an interesting report and used a good range of topic-related vocabulary. It might have been better if you had related the training courses to your own needs - although you say you are going to do this in your introduction, when you actually deal with the matter of training, you do not relate it to yourself. You could also have written a little more, as your answer is under-length. There are also a number of basic grammatical errors, for example in tenses, so do check your work carefully when you have finished writing.				
16. Wiktor Martczak	2	3	3	3
COMMENTS: This sounds like an interesting job. Unfortunately, you did not analyse what the task was asking you to do adequately, and your answer is also under-length, so could have been developed more. Rather than general improvements to the job, you should have suggested further training that might be useful to you. Perhaps you could also develop the points about your achievements a little more. Your ideas are generally well organised, and you use a suitable level of language.				
17. Michal Krzanowski	2	2	2	1
COMMENTS: You have some very good ideas and organised them in paragraphs. You have also given them headings, but you have not always covered the point mentioned in the headings in the paragraph. For example, although you have mentioned the problems, and referred to future plans, you have not actually said what the future plans are. Please note that the future plans were also supposed to be for training that you would like to do. There are rather a large number of errors, which make your meaning less than clear. It might be a good idea to do a grammar review, and make sure you leave time to check your writing carefully.				

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18. Bartosz Salata	5	5	4	3
COMMENTS: This is a clear and well written report, which addresses all parts of the task fully. You have communicated your message very clearly. You use a good range of vocabulary, but it would be a good idea to do some work on the use of the article, and you could also check up on when to use the simple past/past perfect and present simple/present continuous.				
19. Andrzej Jedraskzek	5	4	3	3
COMMENTS: You have addressed the question well, and covered all parts of the task fully. There was some confusion caused by ambiguous word choice when you mentioned being unable to defend someone and being beaten. As 'to defend' and 'to beat' are terms that would normally be used in legal matters, it would have been better if you had made it clear that you had been physically attacked. You could do some work on the use of the article, for example, and don't forget to check your work for errors when you have finished writing.				
20. Adrian Miksa	5	3	3	2
COMMENTS: You have covered all parts of the task fully and addressed the question well. Your ideas are logically organised in paragraphs. There are a number of errors, however, that have a negative effect on the clarity of your message. It would be worth doing a good review of when to use the article, for example, and of the use of the present perfect. You should also leave enough time to check for errors when you have finished writing.				
21. Jakub Debski	5	4	3	2
COMMENTS: This is an effective report, and you have covered the three parts of the task well, with appropriate development. You could work on the organisation of your ideas at sentence level, for example, it would be useful to review the use of the relative pronouns, 'which' and 'that', as you seem to be using 'what' instead. It is also important that you should pay a little more attention to the grammar that you use, and it would be a good idea to work on the use of the article, in particular.				
22. Aleksandra Barczuch	2	2	2	1
COMMENTS: You have organised your ideas into appropriate paragraphs with headings, and you have used an appropriate style for a report, although you should work on developing the range of words and phrases you are able to use to introduce and link your ideas. Unfortunately, you have not fully addressed the question, as you have not suggested any ideas for training that might be useful for you. There are also a number of errors, both in grammar and word choice, so it might be a good idea to do a thorough grammar review to 'lift' the level of your language. You should also check your work very carefully when you have finished writing.				
23. Kamil Tomczak	4	2	3	2
COMMENTS: You have presented your ideas very logically, but you have not written enough words, so your writing is not as fully developed as it could have been. For example, in your conclusion you mention three problems - you could perhaps have mentioned them in the paragraph about achievements. It seems as if it is now time to work on expanding the range of grammar and vocabulary you use to 'lift' the level of your work and make the expression of your ideas a little more complex.				

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24. Julia Witaszek	5	1	2	1
COMMENTS: Although you have covered all the points, and organised them into suitable paragraphs, it is important that you read through your work to make sure your message is clear. You probably could have come up with one or two more achievements. Although you use some good individual items of vocabulary, the grammar you use to link them isn't always accurate or appropriate, which leads to lack of clarity. It would be a good idea to do a thorough grammar review.				
25. Klaudia Banaszczyk	5	2	3	2
COMMENTS: You have organised your ideas logically in appropriate paragraphs with headings, suitable for a report. At times your choice of language is too informal for a report, for example, 'make me crazy', 'riddles' and 'puzzled out', and at times your message is not clear. There are also a number of basic errors, so make sure you leave enough time at the end to go through your writing carefully.				
26. Marta Morawska	4	2	3	2
COMMENTS: Although you have mentioned all three parts of the task, you did not develop the idea of future training adequately, and overall, your writing is too short. Although there are some basic errors, it seems that your English is now at a stage where you should be able to expand the range of grammar and vocabulary you can use accurately and with confidence.				
27. Katarzyna Jedraszek	5	2	3	1
COMMENTS: You have covered all the points, although you have not written enough and could have developed your answer more. You have organised your ideas into suitable paragraphs and written in a style suitable for a report. However, you now need to expand the range of grammar and vocabulary you are able to use accurately, and don't forget to check your work carefully for errors when you have finished writing.				
28. Aleksandra Walter	5	2	3	2
COMMENTS: You have addressed the task well, and ordered your ideas logically. However, at times, errors in the grammar and vocabulary you use make your message less than clear. This is a pity, as your writing shows promise. It is important that you read through your work carefully for errors and for clarity, so that your message is completely clear. You should work on expanding the range of grammar and vocabulary you can use accurately, so that you can make the correct choice of language.				
29. Klaudia Zawadzka	3	2	3	1
COMMENTS: You have covered the three points that you were asked to cover, however, you have not related them to your own experience. Your report is well organised in a format suitable for a report. Although you have used some good individual items of vocabulary, at times your choice of word obscures meaning, or is inappropriate, and there are a lot of basic errors, which you will need to work on avoiding. Always make sure you read through your work carefully for errors in singular and plural forms, for example.				
30. Karolina Marcinkiewicz	5	5	4	3
COMMENTS: You have addressed the task fully and in a very thoughtful way. You have organised your ideas logically and used a suitable format and style for a report of this kind. There are some errors, so it is important that you try and avoid these. It looks as if your writing is slightly over-length. If so, it would be better to write a little less, and spend more time at the end checking your work for errors.
